

FURMAN'S ELITE-20 POWER FACTOR

Dedicated to cleaning up power lines plagued with RF and EMI, the Elite-20 is fitted with the company's Series Multi-Stage Protection featuring Extreme Voltage Shutdown (EVS) as well as remote control capability via 12V triggering—compatible with the 12V triggering devices commonly found in power receivers and pre-amp processors. Additional products (such as a remote subwoofer) can be daisy-chained from the 12V output jack for an additional triggered unit. The Elite-20 reserves in excess of 4 Amps of continuous current reserve (over 55 amps peak charge) for the most extreme peak power demands. **▶215**



SONANCE'S CABINET SUBWOOFERS

Each of the new models—the 12-250, 10-150, and 8-100—begins with a family of anodized-aluminum drivers in dimensions of 12, 10, and 8-inches respectively. The 12-250 combines a 12-inch aluminum-cone driver with 250 watts of built-in power to deliver true bass extension down to 22 Hz—from a cabinet that measures just 15x18x16 inches. The 10-150 has 28 Hz bass extension from a 10-inch driver/150 watts combination, while the model 8-100's 8-inch transducer and 100-watt electronics combine for a 35 Hz figure and for dimensions of 12x14x12 inches. Each subwoofer has a high-gloss black finish with black-knit grilles. All three are now available at the following manufacturer's suggested pricing: 12-250, \$1,000; the 10-150, \$750; and the 8-100, \$525. **▶216**



TRIBUTARIES' DUO OF SWITCHERS

The HX410 and HX410A can each select from among four HDMI sources—DVD players, Blu-ray Disc or HD DVD high-definition disc players, and cable, satellite, or broadcast hi-def set-top/boxes or tuners—and output signals—to a single HDMI output. Both models include Signal Enhancement, which engages active equalization to maintain full-integrity HDMI transmissions even over long cable runs, with each model's built-in booster enabling it to be mounted along with the other equipment and still run 30 meters of 1080p signal after the unit. The HX410A goes even further: it includes both optical and coaxial S/PDIF digital-audio ports for each input and at its single output, allowing the audio and video signals to be routed independently. The HX410 and HX410A are supplied with a convenient "credit-card"-style infrared remote that delivers direct-access selection among its four HDMI (or HDMI + digital audio) inputs by simply pressing numeric keys 1 through 4; the remote also provides power on/off. An RS-232 serial port enables them to be fully integrated into a multiroom media system or touchscreen-controlled home theater, incorporating serial commands for input select, power on/off, and signal-enhance enable/disable. 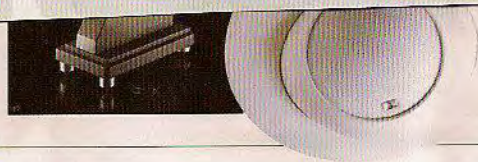
